2019 Financial Committee Recommendations – 2019 Proposed Budget: Clarify Membership - ByLaws

A copy of the 2019 Proposed Budget was email out to Board Members.

Bob asked what the Finance Contractor line item was. It is for Sandy Chandler. At the Finance Committee Meeting, Carolyn suggested an increase to \$1,000, due to mailings and additional tasks Sandy would be providing for KFA.

Jim Hays moved and Carolyn 2nd, to approve. Passed

Bob reviewed Sandy's time sheet and summarized to the board. For the time period of November 15, 2018 to February 11, 2019 there was a total of 33 hrs, for a cost of \$495.

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Carolyn moved to approve the bill be paid, Wayne White 2nd. Passed.

Tom has the incentives to get mailed out and will get them to Sandy.

The membership dues and donation form is confusing. It needs to be clarified better as to rather Tree Farmers and Walnut Council members are to pay dues. This needs to be discussed and modified in the bylaws.

Program Director Report: Shane Neel

Shane provided the cost of member signs. They are \$20.55 each. He has 20 ordered and total cost for 20 will be \$411.00. Not sure when they will be in but will forward to Board the information.

Carolyn asked about the bill being authorized to pay. Since it has been budgeted for 2019, it can be paid.

Shane had a summary of the In-kind for the Water Quality Advocate, a grant with Kansas Forest Service. \$80,000 is KFA match and currently \$36,757 has been figured. This is with KFA members and volunteer hours and mileage. It is from July 2017 to current date. There is more to come in. The grant is for 3 years and there shouldn't be a problem meeting the match.

Shane explained that an Advocate can request to be reimbursed for travel on the training. Sometimes it takes a while for a reimbursement to go through the University and State of Kansas, who issues the check. Kansas Forest Service is asking for KFA to pay the mileage for individuals and then bill KFS to get reimbursed, to quicken the payment. KFA wouldn't be making the decision for reimbursement, Shane as KFS Forester would. It will be to issue a check to the individual and get reimbursed by Kansas Forest Service. No budget line item needs to be approved, since it isn't any expense or income to KFA.

Wayne White, moved to approve. Charlie 2nd. Passed.

Shane will work out an agreement with Amy Hoffman, KFS and Sandy.

Currently there are 28 Trained Advocates and 18 to be trained. Only 2 have asked for reimbursement. KFA Board will revisit if need be.

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Bob commented that Kansas Forest Service is no longer asking KFA for in-kind, letter of support for the windbreak.

On behalf of KFA a letter of support was written for a grant proposal with KU Engineering Department, US Forest Service for woodland owners. No financial, or in-kind support is required. (Letter will be sent to Exec Committee, Shane will send out)

Briefly discussed the climate conference. Bob has a 2 page summary and will send out to the Board.

National Walnut Council (NWC) will let us know about the donations.

KFA Sponsored Research Grants - Ryan Rastok

Grants Committee:

This is for the Memorial honors funds. To see if they qualify for those funds. Small grants to supplemental research grants. Bob would suggest that the committee review and then get board of approval. About \$2,000 currently. Standing grants committee will need to review. Committee should outline what types of grants and limitations. Grant application to be developed by the committee. Will then submit to the board for approval.

ATFS PLT Grant - Carolyn

Received the funds from the Tree Farm System, passed them on to KACEE. KACEE managed the funds. Did workshop on PLT in July 2018, 2nd component to have a workshop in PLT & WILD to visit a tree farm. Had about 12 participants. KACEE Executive Director Laura Downey will submit the report to ATFS in March. Grant is finished.
